Accomplishments throughout the year included:

<u>January:</u> Thursday night Second Hand Prose sales were suspended for January and February. Members supported library warrant articles on the town ballot.

<u>March:</u> Second Hand Prose at Night re-opened. Second Hand Prose supplied books to stock Benson's Little Free Library.

<u>April:</u> National Library Week was celebrated with a well-attended 12:30-1:30 pizza lunch for the staff. During the staff lunch Betsey Martel was honored for her 10 years of service; Sarah Levesque was recognized for her 5 years of service; and appreciation was expressed to Library Voluteens & Volunteers. An ad thanking our Business Members was placed in the NLW edition of the HLN. The Children's Room received monies for National Poetry Contest prizes, and the Little Author's program. The Friends sponsored a well-attended Genealogy Club program on 'DNA'.

<u>May</u>: The Friends helped stock Benson's Little Free Library with books from Second Hand Prose. Monies were authorized for the Greater Hudson Chamber of Commerce Networking event on May 24. Refreshments, gift baskets, displays, and information packets were enjoyed by 50 attendees. An Affinity Account at TD Bank was established.
