Accomplishments throughout the year included:

<u>January:</u> Vinyl bags for kits were purchased for the Children's Room. Funds were authorized to purchase framed art posters for the two Study Rooms. A bulletin board illustrating FOL activities was prepared for display at Second Hand Prose.

<u>February</u>: Second Hand Prose at Night was suspended for the months of February and March. Attendance had been low due to Daylight Saving and weather conditions, and it had been difficult to find Friends who were able to staff the book sale on weekday evenings.

<u>April</u>: National Library Week was celebrated with a 5pm Friday reception.
