

CHILDREN'S ACTIVITIES

Family Fun Night for ages 4-3rd grade is an evening story time where we share themed stories, songs, crafts and activities. FFN meets the third Thursday of the month at 6:30pm.

Story Spinners for grades 3-5 is held the first and third Tuesdays of the month at the Ferry Street Annex from 3:30-4:45. We read and discuss a book from a series, do themed crafts and have a snack. Diverse reading abilities welcome.

Story times for 3-5 year olds: Choose from one of two weekday story times on either Mondays or Thursdays at 10am. We read stories, sing songs and make a craft. Parents stay with their children and participate. Each session runs 8-10 weeks. If someone misses two weeks in a row without calling to keep their place, we must call the next person on the waiting list. Those waiting have first opportunity to register for the new session. All participants must re-register for each new session.

Lullaby Lapsit for infants to 2 year olds will meet every Friday for eight weeks. Complete with tickle songs, nursery rhymes and poems, this program lasts about 45 minutes with the last 15 minutes set aside for parents to read to their children.

New FAFSA Worksheet

More than 88% of all FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) are now being filed electronically! In the past, many people have filled out a FAFSA form prior to filing online, hoping to make completing the online process easier.

However, they have discovered the online experience is not identical to the paper form: the FAFSA on the Web is able to skip questions and present topics in a different order depending upon the user's answers to prior questions.

The Department of Education has thus created a new online form known as the *FAFSA on the Web Worksheet*. Filling it out prior to starting the online FAFSA should organize all of the required information so it's easy to find.

This form cannot be mailed in as an application for financial aid, and there is no requirement that it be used. It is an aid only. The standard paper FAFSA form is still available for those who prefer to file offline. Both the FAFSA on the Web Worksheet and the paper FAFSA form are available at the library. Students and families may also print the Worksheet from the FAFSA website at www.fafsa.ed.gov, or call 1-800-4 FED-AID to request single copies.
