New Automotive Database

The Library now has a subscription to EBSCO's online Auto Repair Reference Center. This database includes more than 150 easy-to-read, illustrated auto repair manuals on all auto repair procedures for about 26,000 domestic and imported vehicles. Included are 100,000 enhanced wiring diagrams, technical service bulletins, and over 150,000 factory drawings with step-by-step photographs. Repair manuals for most vintage cars start back as far as 1945. You will also find *Auto Care & Repair Tips* which covers 33 topics on car care and maintenance, such as how to perform a tune-up. The Trouble Shooting section provides suggestions on what to check when diagnosing car problems, for instance, grinding brakes. Auto Repair Reference is updated regularly, so the information is always current.

Access to this database is available in the library, or in the comfort of your home/office. If you choose the option to access ARRC remotely (not in the library), make sure you have your library card number and pin number handy. If you do not have your pin number yet, stop by the library or give us a call to choose one. Whether you are working on your 1984 Mustang, building an entire engine or just changing a filter, you can just print off the section you need. *Auto Repair Reference Center* gives you the help you need to do the job!

July 24, 7– 8:30 p.m. Card Trickery


Join magician Glen Walant as he demonstrates some of his astounding tricks. He will then teach the amazed audience how to do a few tricks of their own.
